Please join us for our fourth annual Spring Retreat at Wisdom House. We are exploring an important but often neglected topic, "The Great War in Prose and Poetry," and will be discussing some of the most powerful antiwar literature in modern English poetry, memoir, and fiction:

Selected Poems by Poets of the Great War, including Siegfried Sassoon, Wilfred Owen, Robert Graves, Isaac Rosenberg

Testament of Youth by Vera Brittain, the elegiac memoir that defined a generation and that speaks to anyone whose life has been changed by war.

Regeneration by Pat Barker, a war saga in which no guns are fired: the battle is for a man's mind, and the reader must decide who is the victim, the victor, or the vanquished. The novel explores the effect of the war on identity, masculinity, and social structure.

Birdsong by Sebastian Faulks, a war novel and family saga that focuses on how the experience of trauma shapes individual psyches. It also addresses metahistorical questions of how we recover and document narratives of the past.

Wisdom House is an interfaith retreat and conference center on 70 quiet country acres in the foothills of the Berkshires in Northwest Connecticut. The quiet, comfortable bedrooms are **dormitory-style with shared bathrooms** and are accessible by elevator. Delicious healthy meals are prepared by Chef Margaret Jacobs, a graduate of the Culinary Institute of America. Reasonable efforts will be made to accommodate your dietary requests, and refrigerators are available for any food items your special diet requires.
